RE: USDA's Farm and Food Workers Relief Grant Program – Payments for Federally Recognized Tribal Citizens through Cherokee Nation

## Dear President Katchatag,

The Farm and Food Workers Relief Program was created, through USDA funding, to offset unexpected costs brought on by the pandemic, such as purchasing protective gear, paying for testing, and costs associated with quarantine requirements for both agricultural and meatpacking workers.

Cherokee Nation has been awarded \$45,948,000 from the USDA's Farm and Food Workers Relief Program to grant 68,541 eligible, frontline agriculture and meat packing workers, a one-time flat payment of \$600 to offset costs incurred during the pandemic.

## Eligibility requirements include:

- Must have been 18 at the time that work was performed.
- Must have been paid for at least one hour of agricultural work on a farm or ranch, or in a meat processing facility within the period of January 27, 2020, through May 11, 2023.
- Must be a citizen of a federally recognized tribe in the United States and provide proof of tribal citizenship (Official tribal citizenship record with name, DOB, address) or a U.S. citizen residing within the Cherokee Nation Reservation.
- Must provide proof of identification (State or federally issued ID- driver's license, passport, military ID, tribal identification card)
- Must provide proof of employment (W2, employment letter, or paystubs). A

  Additional Information.
- Must <u>not</u> be an owner/operator of the farm or facility where work was performed.
- Must <u>not</u> apply with work related to marijuana due to its status as a Schedule I substance under the Controlled Substance Act.
